



Designed for therapists, clergy and individuals who wish to learn more about understanding dreams, projective dream work, and how dream work can enhance the therapeutic process.

TWO YEAR DREAM WORK TRAINING



This two-year course, focused on dream work in the Jungian tradition, is for individuals, therapists, and clergy who wish to gain competence and skills in understanding dreams, projective dream work and the transforming messages that dreams can offer. The purpose of the Dream Work Training Course is to:

- Develop knowledge of Carl Jung's analytical psychology, including concepts such as archetype, complex, individuation, and personality typology.
- Gain an appreciation of the dynamic nature of dreams and how they reflect the totality of self.
- Deepen inner awareness with regular personal dream work practices and through work with a dream counselor.
- Develop understanding of the symbology of dreams through amplification, poetry, fairy tale, dream theater, active imagination, role play and myth.
- Learn to work with individuals to translate their dream messages into conscious meaning.
- Learn the basics of the science and psychology of dreaming and dream work.
- Gain experience and skill in group projective dream work through facilitated and self-led practice.
- Expose participants to Zen meditation, active imagination, journaling, poetry, guided imagery, creative expression, embodiment and energy awareness.
- Explore the nature of dreamwork within and across cultures and religious traditions.



There are three four-day intensives each year at the Kanuga Conference Center in Hendersonville, NC. Each intensive includes lectures and discussion with faculty and mentors, as well as staff-led dream practicum groups and one-on-one dream work case studies, demonstrations, dream theater, socials, embodiment practices (like Tai Chi, yoga, and meditation), creative art space, relaxation and fun in the Blue Ridge Mountains of North Carolina. Mentor-guided reading and writing assignments between intensives enhance skills and understanding. Faculty members, who are recognized as the best in the nation in dream work, rotate through the curriculum, allowing participants to experience the entire faculty.

ALLEN PROCTOR: Director of the Haden Institute, spiritual director and Presbyterian Minister. Allen works with others to explore questions of identity, relationships, vocation and meaning, using Dream Work, the Enneagram, the Myers-Briggs Type Indicator, meditation practices and creation spirituality.



JOYCE ROCKWOOD-HUDSON: Episcopal laywoman, author of seven books and recipient of four major book awards. She is founding editor of *The Rose* and author of *Natural Spirituality: A Handbook for Jungian Inner Work in Spiritual Community*.

BOB HADEN: Director Emeritus of the Haden Institute, Episcopal priest, Practicing Pastoral Counselor and Spiritual Director with a Jungian orientation. He is author of *Soul's Labyrinth* and *Unopened Letters from God: Using Biblical Dreams to Unlock Your Nightly Dreams*.



SHERI KLING: A public theologian who focuses on ideas and practices that positively impact humans' relationships with God, self, and world, especially the use of dream work as a spiritual practice for divine encounter, personal integration, and widening our relationship to creation.

Singer, songwriter, and essayist, a composer of several hymns featuring eco-process theology, and considers herself a "voice for transformation".

DIANA MCKENDREE: Has a passion for working with the dream and images. Diana is a skilled dream work facilitator, educator, keynote speaker, consultant, leader of women's pilgrimages and iconographer. She is a faculty member with the Haden Institute, teaching Spiritual Direction and Dream Work, serving as both a mentor and as mentor to the Haden Institute mentors. Ordained an Interfaith Minister, Diana continues to search for the common threads that weave humanity and soul together.



ROBERT HOSS: Past president of the International Assoc. for the Study of Dreams (IASD), Director of the DreamScience Foundation, and author of *Dream Language* and *Dream to Freedom*. He has done significant research into color in dreams and is trained in Gestalt Therapy.



CATHY SMITH BOWERS: Former Poet Laureate of NC, she teaches poetry in the MFA program at Queens University, Charlotte, NC. Her published poetry collections include *The Love That Ended Yesterday in Texas*, and *Traveling in Times of Danger*.
